3. Eligibility

To remain in University housing, Student must be enrolled fulltime, meaning at least 12 credit hours per semester for undergraduate students, and at least six (6) credit hours per semester for graduate students (students in eight (8)-week programs would be considered fulltime if taking at least three (3) credit hours per eight (8)-week session). Student must maintain good financial standing, with all tuition, room and board, and other fees, charges, fines, and penalties charged

in full prior to the beginning of the academic term, and no outstanding delinquencies. At all times, Student must remain in compliance with this Contract and becomes ineligible for on-campus housing because of a failure to comply with the foregoing

requirements, University has the right to remove Student from on-campus housing.

8. Closings/Breaks

University reserves the right to close any on-campus housing at any time for any reason, including, without limitation, safety, maintenance, or repairs, in y sole discretion. For security reasons, on-campus housing is closed during winter break and such other breaks as University may determine during the academic term. These dates are posted in the Office of Academic Services and on the Student Portal. Residences are locked at noon on the Saturday of final exams week for the fall and spring semesters. On-campus housing will reopen the day before classes resume after the break. o
